Message from The Chairperson

Sometimes at local events our management committee members and street coordinators are asked to explain why our organisation exists and how we support our local communities. Within reason, we are always happy to consider leading or supporting good causes and public information events that will enhance community connectedness, good health and wellbeing. Your ideas are always welcome and appreciated.

As members of Neighbourhood Support Hamilton, you are probably aware that our organisation is part of a nationwide community-led movement that has been working alongside New Zealand Police and other partners for 25 years. Neighbourhood Support New Zealand is made up of a network of community organisations that currently support over 200,000 households across the country.

Our partner agencies include New Zealand Red Cross, the National Emergency Management Agency, Community Patrols New Zealand, and Fire and Emergency New Zealand. We are also closely connected to Neighbourhood Watch Australasia.

Neighbourhood Support brings people and neighbourhoods together to create safe, resilient, and connected communities. We believe that a well-connected community helps to improve safety, resilience, and wellbeing for all, so that our towns and neighbourhoods are great places to live in.

Some members connect at street meetings and barbeques, some stay connected online and by email, others by being part of a neighbourhood phone tree. By staying connected, and supporting each other, we can make our neighbourhoods safe and welcoming for all.

The qualities that make a cop

Our organisation has people with different backgrounds, experiences and interests. What unites us is that we're all working toward the same vision - we want to make New Zealand the safest country in the world.

We encourage applications from anyone who's got what it takes, regardless of your gender, ethnicity, culture, sexuality, or faith. We're also very interested in applicants who understand different languages and cultures. New Zealand's diversity is growing, so bring your background and values to the job.

Above all else, you'll want to help people in your community. You'll need to make tough calls, build community networks, and instill confidence in those around you. You'll understand the communities you serve and identify and examine the problems that lead to trouble.





This role can influence the lives of many. If you decide to push ahead and apply, our constabulary recruitment staff will look to see if you have these meaningful qualities:

- · Outstanding communication skills
- · Empathy for others
- Commitment
- Integrity
- Problem-solving abilities

A sense of humour is also pretty important.

To enhance these qualities, you could do some work in your community - perhaps working with a community group, joining a community patrol, coaching a sports team, mentoring young people, volunteering or fundraising.

Here are the must haves:

- You must be at least 17 years old to apply and 18 when you start at Police College. There's no upper age limit
- You must be a New Zealand or Australian citizen or have New Zealand permanent residency
- · You must be able to speak, read, write and listen in English
- · You must be physically fit
- · You must have good eyesight
- · You must have a full New Zealand Driver Licence

You'll also need to:

- Let our recruitment staff know about any previous criminal or traffic convictions including warnings, court appearances, and diversions
- Provide police clearance for any other country you've worked or lived in for longer than three months.
